



Ignition Point captures the precise, volatile moment where raw impulse breaks free into consciousness. Built upon a heavy, dark-textured impasto foundation, the canvas holds the weight of structural tension and unseen turmoil. Out of this dark stillness comes an eruption—fiery crimson, deep amber, and brilliant red splatters cut through the surface, marking the exact instant energy turns into motion.

At its core, the piece reflects the universal human condition: the quiet, unseen accumulation of thought, pressure, and emotion that precedes every meaningful transformation. Creation rarely begins in complete clarity; it originates in dense, chaotic depths. The dark, sculpted under layers embody the heavy architecture of our internal landscape—the unresolved tensions, quiet persistence, and subterranean forces we carry. The sudden, vivid eruption of color represents the awakening—the spark where dormant potential refuses containment and shatters the status quo. Ignition Point stands as a meditation on the beauty of necessary upheaval, reminding us that clarity is not the absence of chaos, but the light born directly from it.

In the Midst of Chaos

A raw exploration of turbulence caught in the act of transformation. Grounded in the movement from chaos to order, this piece captures the moment where raw energy peaks before finding its natural equilibrium. Applying my Layers of Impulse technique, unthinned pigment is sculpted with direct, decisive strokes, allowing high-contrast textures to break through and define the surface. The result is a visceral mindscape — a visual sanctuary carved directly out of storm and structure.

Tectonic Impressions — IGNIS

A four-panel mindscape exploring the journey from Chaos to Order. Using my signature Layers of Impulse technique, each panel begins with tectonic ridges carved directly into unthinned paint — pure structure. Because, a sudden release of raw energy is introduced, then gradually organized through focused layering into balanced harmony. Seen together, the four panels read as one continuous transformation from impulse to order.

Medium: Acrylic on canvas, palette knife technique, Acrylic Ink flow, splatter

Vertical Drift: Dawn

A mindscape where gravity loses its grip — a diptych exploring a landscape in rebellion, where the earth itself is pulled upward into the sky, turning the traditional horizon upside down. Heavy body acrylics were sculpted thickly with a palette knife into rugged, ascending terrain, the textured ridges catching the shifting light of early morning as they rush skyward. Fluid acrylic inks add high-energy splatters across a deep cobalt background, capturing fragments of earth caught mid-ascent across a fractured threshold.

Medium: Heavy acrylic, palette knife, and acrylic inks on paper

Size: A4 per panel (2 panels)

Format: Original diptych – A – Tectonic Mindscape



The Birth

Fire and water collide, creating a radiant burst of orange and gold above a blue sea. Its rays cut through a deep crimson sky and dissolve into white-capped waves. The moment marries raw energy above with restless motion below toward a luminous horizon. The composition holds two opposing forces in balance. Mindscales captures creation between chaos and calm at a single horizon. A final note lingers as light meets water.
